A highly decorated pioneer in the development of the U.S. Navy's nuclear submarine program will be honored as the Wyoming School Foundation's 2003 Distinguished Alumnus/Master Teacher on Tuesday September 23 at the Pendery Center for the Arts at nationally recognized Wyoming High School, 106 Pendery Avenue, off Springfield Pike.

He is Admiral C.R. "Bob" Bell, a 1948 graduate of Wyoming High School and a 1953 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy.
